IN A NUTSHELL:

North lowa looks to get out of town with wins in three of their four outings at the NAHL Showcase.

ALL-TIME SERIES:

First meeting.

LAST TIME OUT:

North lowa had its date with the Amarillo Wranglers circled on its calendar ever since the announcement of the matchup in early August, and the power play was exceptional in Friday's get-together, going 3-for-5 for a 4-1 victory over the team that replaced the Bulls in the Panhandle during the offseason. Facing a former North Iowa goaltender, the Bulls snagged a 5-on-3 goal from Sean Vlasich, who rattled one home with 8:33 remaining in the first period, and a 5-on-4 from Logan Dombrowsky just a couple of minutes later. Dombrowsky stepped up again in the second period, scoring the game's first 5-on-5 goal with just five minutes left before the intermission. Though North lowa was perfect on the penalty kill, the Wranglers nearly caught them in the third period - just two seconds after the end of a hooking minor to Charlie Tuggey, Logan Cleary faced up and fired one past Cullen DeYoung to trim the lead to 3-1. The Bulls got one last power play late, and capitalized again with a one-timer from Luka Sukovic. DeYoung made 33 saves for his first North lowa win, while Gutjahr was limited to 27 saves in taking the loss. Dombrowsky picked up two goals and an assist for his efforts.

NEXT HOME GAME:

North Iowa opens its 2021-22 home schedule on Friday, September 24 against Aberdeen. That game kicks off the Bulls' "1 Town, 2 Teams, 3 Days, 4 Games" weekend alongside the new Mason City Toros, with free schedule posters to be given away at Friday's game.

THE HUNTED:

The Bulls' opponent in this one is a Brown Bears team still looking for some traction as the season gets going. After suffering a sweep at the hands of the Chippewa Steel, Kenai River has taken losses in two of its three games at the NAHL Showcase. The Brown Bears gutted out a 2-1 win on Thursday over the Johnstown Tomahawks, but were forced to battle back in a 3-2 loss on Friday to the Maine Nordiques. Reese Farrell had two goals and an assist for Maine in the win, gaining control of the game with a power play goal just 1:40 into the second period.

MOVIN' ON UP:

This opponent is one of several that North Iowa could face this season with a player from last season's national championship-winning group on the roster. The Bulls took down Amarillo, and former Bulls Max Gutjahr and Jase Sofo yesterday, and face former defenseman Caleb Huffman in this game. Also due up for North Iowa is a December weekend with the Springfield Jr. Blues, whose roster includes top 2020-21 scorer Carson Jones – both Jones and Huffman tendered with their respective teams prior to the Bulls' announced move to the NAHL. The Minot Minotauros roster also has a former Bull: defenseman Noah Roitman, who spent 2019-20 with North Iowa and also opened 2020-21 on the Bulls roster.

A MILESTONE SEASON:

Kenai River is one of only a few teams on North Iowa's schedule this year that existed during North Iowa's last NAHL season in 2009-10 - the Brown Bears are celebrating their 15th anniversary this year, but dropped all four of their meetings with the former North Iowa Outlaws in 2007 and 2009.

SHOW OFF YOUR POWER:

North lowa's 4-for-15 mark on the power play is not a number that will jump off the page by itself, but the Bulls used a huge outing on Friday evening to help get them there - their 3-for-5 finish is the team's first three-goal power play outing since scoring thrice on the man-advantage in the Fraser Cup tourney against the Northeast Generals this past April. That game ended with an 8-1 North lowa win and sealed the top spot in their Fraser Cup pool.

NEXT MAN IN:

The Bulls lost seven of their top nine scorers from last year's Amarillo team, but that has hardly slowed this group down - of the seven North lowa players who have scored more than a point so far at the NAHL Showcase, only Michael Mesic did not play for Amarillo last season. With four points, leading scorer Logan Dombrowsky is already approaching his total of five points from last year, which he achieved in 29 games.
