# IN A NUTSHELL:

North lowa looks for revenge after having its home-opening party spoiled last night.

#### **ALL-TIME SERIES:**

North Iowa trails, 0-1 (Bulls: 1-0-1 vs. Wings in 2021 preseason)

#### LAST TIME OUT:

The Bulls opened their first-ever home schedule in the NAHL last night against the defending Robertson Cup runner-up, and got the crowd to its feet early with a goal from Chris Carroll just 49 seconds in. However, Aberdeen scored three unanswered goals to steal a 3-2 win and dampen the mood in the Mason City Arena. North Iowa and Aberdeen traded goals just 15 seconds apart in the opening period, with Michael Mesic sneaking one over Kyle Kozma's right shoulder at 6:34 and Luke Amell answering for the Wings at 6:49. The tying goal came at 13:25 off the stick of Jackson Yee, and the only goal the rest of the way came with 7:17 remaining in the second period, with Devon Carlstrom scoring from atop the faceoff circles. Cullen DeYoung stopped 23 shots, suffering his first loss after winning two games at last week's NAHL Showcase. Kozma won the game on the strength of 33 saves, and both teams were outstanding on the penalty kill, going 6-for-6.

#### **UPCOMING PROMOTIONS:**

North lowa welcomes Austin next Friday night as the Bulls flip on the "Friday Night Lights" - Bulls players will be available for postgame autographs following their game against the Bruins..

#### A DRY RUN:

These same teams met two weeks ago as North Iowa took on its first NAHL opponent in a couple of unofficial preseason matchups. The Bulls would have earned three of a possible four points on the weekend, with Ryan Coughlin racking up a hat trick in a 7-1 Friday night win over the Wings. Andrew Takacs went 40 minutes for the win, making 17 saves. The following afternoon, the Bulls fell behind 3-0 going into the second period, trailing 19-7 in the shots-on-goal department. Still down three with 11 seconds to go, Michael Mesic shrank the lead to 4-2, and Hunter Bulger buried two goals in the third period to tie the contest. However, Aberdeen earned the 5-4 win 52 seconds into overtime with Landry Schmuck's second goal of the game.

### A LITTLE BIT OVER THE TOP:

After only five games, North lowa forward Logan Dombrowsky has already topped his season total from a year ago with six points. Splitting time between the forward and defense spots, the Wisconsin native scored just one goal in 29 games for Amarillo, but he racked up three goals in the NAHL Showcase last week, including two against the brand-new Wranglers.

#### **HUNDO P:**

North lowa's captain continues to make his presence known after notching a milestone appearance last Saturday against the Kenai River Brown Bears -Ryan Coughlin made his 100th NAHL appearance in a 6-2 win, notching a goal and an assist. The mark does not include his four playoff appearances in last season's South Division Semifinals against Shreveport, nor does it include three USHL games split between the Omaha Lancers and Muskegon Lumberjacks. Coughlin set up Mesic's insurance goal in last night's game, and is up to seven points in just five games.

#### **TAKING FLIGHT:**

Just like their hosts, the Wings won three of their four games at the Showcase, losing only the Robertson Cup Final rematch against the Shreveport Mudbugs, 1-0. Cade Neilson, who scored a power play goal in the Saturday preseason game at North Iowa, piled up three goals and three assists in Blaine to lead the Aberdeen effort. The British native highlighted his week with a goal and two assists in the Wings' 6-3 win over the Springfield Jr. Blues.

### IT'S THE CLIMB:

Carsen Stokes has settled in quite nicely at the NAHL level after making the jump from the North lowa Bulls' Fraser Cup championship team last year, with a .958 save percentage last week against his former team. In the win over the Wilderness, he defeated one of the two Division I-committed goaltenders (Jacob Zacharewicz, Brown University) that he found himself stuck behind last year before joining the North Iowa roster.
