IN A NUTSHELL:

North Iowa goes for the sweep after earning a win Friday night in its first-ever meeting with the Minotauros.

ALL-TIME SERIES:

North Iowa leads, 1-0-0.

LAST TIME OUT:

The first-ever "Battle of the Cattle" between the Bulls and Minotauros tightened in the final period, but North Iowa used a magical start to take a win in the Magic City, earning a 3-2 triumph against Minot on Friday night. Just as he did in last Saturday's game against the Austin Bruins, Byron Hartley opened the action with an early goal, beating the defense into the Minotauros zone and beating Carter Clafton just 2:03 into the game. The lead went from one goal to three goals in less than a minute, with Michael Mesic scoring from the left-wing faceoff circle with 2:06 to go and Max Scott snapping one past Clafton with 1:09 remaining in the period. After holding the three-goal lead for the entire second period, the Bulls ran into David Nesburg in the third period as he tried to get the hosts back into the game - his goal from the slot at 3:52 of the third period cut the lead to 3-1. His joust into the top of the net halfway through the period trimmed the lead back to 3-2, but Minot was never able to tie the game back up. Hunter Garvey made 32 saves for his second win of the year, while backup goaltender Zach Sandy was a perfect 18-for-18 in net in the final 40 minutes. The penalty-killing units for both sides were also perfect, with the Bulls going 4-for-4 against the Minot power play, and Minot going 2-for-2 on the penalty kill.

UPCOMING PROMOTIONS:

North lowa returns home on Friday and Saturday, October 15 and 16 for "Fall Into Hockey" weekend, featuring a pumpkin gutting contest and a pumpkin ring toss at the Friday home game and a fall treats baking contest in Saturday's game against the Minot Minotauros.

TIME TO GET PLUGGED IN:

The penalty-killing unit for the Bulls continues to excel, posting nearly an 88-percent success rate in the opening nine games of the season. The power play, however, is still looking for traction as the Central Division slate continues - North lowa is 0-for its last 22 with the extra man, dating back to the Bulls' power play goal from Greg Japchen midway through the first period against Kenai River at the NAHL Showcase.

CATCHING FIRE:

Bulls forward Chris Carroll is on a roll, riding a seven-game point streak, including three assists against Kenai River in the team's NAHL Showcase finale and two more in Friday's win. The last North Iowa player with a seven-game point streak was Carson Jones, who closed out the month of February with points in seven straight games and earned the NA3HL's Forward of the Month award. No Bulls player exceeded an eight-game point streak in 2020-21.

EARLY EDITION:

North lowa has enjoyed some fast starts this season, and when the Bulls have been able to get the first word, they've been a tough troop to tame - the Bulls have scored first in seven of their nine games this season, starting from behind in only their defeat against Jamestown and their shootout loss to Austin. Of those seven games, the Bulls have walked away with a win six times, losing only their home opener September 24 against Aberdeen. The Bulls have especially come out ahead in the first period this season, outscoring their competition 16-8 in the opening 20 minutes.

DOWN TO THE WIRE:

North lowa's Central Division games, win or lose, have come right down to the final minutes each and every night - the Bulls' five games in divisional play have been decided by a total of six goals, with only their 4-2 win over Austin last Saturday coming by more than one goal. North Iowa ran into a similar stretch late in the 2020-21 NA3HL season, following up a run of four straight one-goal games with a 4-2 home loss to Willmar. Two of those games, both against Granite City, went to shootouts.

GREAT SCOTT:

Max Scott earned his first goal as a North lowa Bull on Friday night after posting nine assists for the Bulls in eight-plus games. The last Bulls player with such a streak was Cal Nauss, who posted nine assists to open his North Iowa career before scoring his first Bulls goal November 30, 2019 at New Ulm.
