MINOT MINOTAUROS



IN A NUTSHELL:

With three straight wins against the Minotauros, North Iowa goes for a sweep for the second straight weekend.

ALL-TIME SERIES:

LAST TIME OUT:

Fans at Friday's game enjoyed a fiery ending, with a donnybrook at the final horn, but it was a hot start that allowed the North Iowa Bulls to get past Minot for their fourth straight win, earning a 3-2 victory on home ice. The Bulls took a 2-0 lead to the locker room, thanks to back-to-back goals just 35 seconds apart - a pass from Chris Carroll off the left-wing wall found Byron Hartley out front at 5:02 of the first for the opening goal, and Justin Mexico's sharpangle chance to the right of Zach Sandy caught the Minotauros' goaltender in the side of the mask and settled in the net for the two-goal lead. The teams would swap goals from then on - David Nesburg's goal just three minutes into the second period trimmed the lead to 2-1, but the Bulls got one back at the 6:39 mark on a shot down the slot from Logan Dombrowsky. A backdoor feed to Zack Simon helped the former Bull earn a goal against his old team with 6:53 remaining in the period, and the teams went scoreless the rest of the way. Four players picked up fighting majors and game misconducts at the end of the contest, with 100 of the game's 120 penalty minutes handed out after the final horn. Hunter Garvey made 30 saves for his fourth straight win, and the teams combined for a perfect 10-for-10 on the penalty kill.

TONIGHT'S PROMOTIONS:

North Iowa finishes its "Fall Into Hockey" promotion tonight, featuring a fall baking contest to be judged during the first intermission. A "Bulls BOGO" is also in effect, with buy-one-get-one-free kids' tickets for tonight's game.

THEY'RE KILLING IT:

The penalty-killing unit for the Bulls continues to excel, wiping out the last 19 power plays against them and posting a 90.2-percent mark on the penalty kill, good for third in the NAHL. The power play, however, is still looking to get plugged in against Central Division opponents - North lowa is 0-for its last 29 with the extra man, dating back to the Bulls' marker from Greg Japchen midway through the first period against Kenai River at the NAHL Showcase.

EIGHT SECONDS:

Bulls forward Chris Carroll's primary assist last night extended his point streak to nine straight games, including five assists over the last three games against the Minotauros. The last North Iowa player with a nine-game point streak or longer was Matt Dahlseide, whose 16-game run wrapped up December 29, 2018 in a 3-1 win at the Rochester Grizzlies.

HEADED FOUR HOME:

This game marks the end of a two-week home-and-home for the Bulls and Minotauros - four-game runs against the same team are a rarity for North lowa, having played the same team four straight games only three times before. In two of those instances - a 2017-18 stretch against the Wausau RiverWolves and a 2012-13 set against the Quad City Jr. Flames - the Bulls won all four meetings.

EASY AS 1-2-3:

Carter Rapalje's shorthanded goal last Saturday night was the game-winner in the Bulls' 6-3 victory, giving him three game-winning goals this season. With three game-winners in his first 10 North Iowa appearances, he is one of the fastest Bulls to ever reach three game-winning goals in a season, with Tim Santopoalo scoring three game-winners in North Iowa's first five games of the 2012-13 season. Kohei Sato (2015-16) and Owen Larson (2016-17) each scored their first three game-winners in fewer than 10 games, and scored their fourth game-winners in their 10th games of the season.

SAVING GRACE:

Hunter Garvey's two wins at Minot last weekend, with a total of 77 saves, helped him become the Bulls' first NAHL Central Division Star of the Week. Garvey made 45 saves last Saturday, the most since Dysen Skinner's 46-save showing against the Rochester Grizzlies in the 2019 NA3HL West Division Semifinals, and the most in a regular-season game since Evan Babekuhl's 47-save overtime outing against the Grizzlies in February of 2019.
