IN A NUTSHELL:

North lowa returns to St. Cloud looking to recapture their place in the win column.

ALL-TIME SERIES:

Tied, 1-1-0 (both games have been won by the road team).

LAST TIME OUT:

The second-longest wait in Bulls Teddy Bear Toss history was well worth it Friday night, but after a quick scoring burst that yielded a 2-0 lead, North Iowa never scored again, and the St. Cloud Norsemen reeled off four unanswered goals for a 4-2 win at the Mason City Arena. St. Cloud controlled the pace in the first period for a 13-2 shots-on-goal advantage, but the Bulls struck on their seventh shot, on Michael Mesic's wrist shot 4:34 into the second period that sent an arena's worth of bears flying onto the ice. Dylan Gajewski added his first goal as a Bull just 84 seconds later for the two-goal margin, but Blake Mesenburg buried chances at 7:56 and 8:36 (the latter coming 11 seconds into a Norsemen power play) to erase the lead. Nik Hong's goal with 3:12 left in the period gave St. Cloud the lead for good, and his shorthanded goal on a 2-on-1 break with 5:21 left in the third iced the first Norsemen victory in their last five tries. Both teams earned their power play goals quickly, with Mesic's coming just 24 seconds into a Bulls power play. Casey Roepke and Andrew Stacey also earned their first Bulls points, earning assists, while Hunter Garvey took the loss for North Iowa with 29 saves.

UPCOMING PROMOTIONS:

North lowa returns home for the Bulls' annual "Naughty and Nice" weekend December 10 and 11 against the Springfield Jr. Blues, with an ugly sweater contest and an appearance by the Grinch on Friday and appearances by Santa and other beloved holiday characters on Saturday. The Bulls will also wear Busch Light-themed jerseys both nights, with a live auction and postgame skate after Saturday's game.

SEA YOU DOWN THE ROAD:

The Bulls have landed a coach into the highest ranks of college hockey, with Alaska-Anchorage's announcement this week that the Seawolves have hired Kevin Murdock as their new assistant coach. Murdock was back in Mason City as the Bulls' Associate Head Coach/General Manager this season after spending two years in Alaska as an NAHL head coach with the Kenai River Brown Bears. He was a vital part of the Bulls' success during his first stint in town from 2016 to 2019, leading the Bulls to 106 regular-season wins, two Fraser Cup tournament appearances and two division championships. UAA is reactivating its hockey program for 2022-23 after a two-year layoff due to financial difficulties, including COVID-related financial fallout.

NOT MES-ING AROUND:

One of North Iowa's top blueliners has been out of the lineup since last Saturday, but not for injury or illness - Jack Mesic received a last-minute call-up to the United States Hockey League and the Lincoln Stars just ahead of their game last weekend against the Omaha Lancers. Mesic reunites with Rocky Russo and George Lewis, his coaches last year with the Amarillo Bulls, and became the first Bull to appear in a USHL game since North lowa's move to the NAHL. He also found himself sharing the ice with the very first Bulls alumnus to play in the USHL, former NA3HL West Division MVP Lucas Wahlin.

TIGHTLY CONTESTED:

The Central Division standings are a roller-coaster ride, with no sign of slowing down as the circuit's teams start to pass the season's 40-percent mark. The Bulls' two losses to Austin last week dropped them out of first place in the standings, but with two games in hand on the Bruins, they remain atop the division in terms of winning percentage, and they have three games in hand on the Minot Minotauros, who sit just a point back of North Iowa for third. St. Cloud is looking to shake off a four-game skid in fifth place, while Bismarck has entered the chat just three points behind the Norsemen. Also in the mix are the Aberdeen Wings, whose shutout win at Austin on Friday propelled them to within two points of Minot with two games in hand on the Minotauros.

JUST SAY YES:

North Iowa forward Dylan Gajewski made the most of his first appearance in a North Iowa uniform Friday night, scoring in the second period of his debut game as a Bull. Gajewski has seen the inside of the Mason City Arena plenty of times as a visitor recently, helping to lead the Willmar WarHawks to their first-ever NA3HL West Division Finals against North lowa last year and tallying five goals and three assists in six visiting appearances. He is also a former Austin Bruin, playing in two of the three Austin road games thus far at Mason City and earning an assist in his November 13 outing.
