

IN A NUTSHELL:

North lowa looks to shake off a rough loss Friday night and make some magic in their final regular-season meeting in the Magic City this year.

ALL-TIME SERIES:

North Iowa leads. 3-2-0 (Bulls won first three matchups, have lost last two).

LAST TIME OUT:

A hot Minotauro team cranked up the pace right off the jump in Friday night's game, picking up the first nine shots on net on the way to a 4-1 win over the Bulls, staying two points back of the Austin Bruins in the hunt for the Central Division lead. After the Bulls got back a couple of shots on net, Minot scored on back-to-back chances two minutes apart - Cole Mickel tossed a point shot toward the back post to beat **Hunter Garvey** with 7:33 remaining in the first period, and a well-screened chance from Colby Joseph on the right wing sneaked past with 5:32 left in the first. The Minotauros held a 15-6 shots-on-goal advantage after one period and extended it to 31-19 after two, but the Bulls trimmed the deficit back to one on a Greg Japchen one-timer from the rightwing circle with 3:03 left in the second period. With a power play goal in hand for each team, Minot picked up a second one at 7:44 of the third, with Kade Nielson tossing home a backdoor feed from Connor McGrath, and a delayed penalty to North Iowa allowed Joseph to take advantage of the extra skater and pick up his second goal nine minutes later. Garvey made 43 saves in the loss, while Austin Zavoda earned his first North American Hockey League win with 26 stops. The power play units were exceptional, as the Minotauros finished 2-for-5 and the Bulls closed out the night at 1-for-4.

NEXT HOME GAME:

North Iowa returns home to face the St. Cloud Norsemen on January 27 for their only Thursday night home game of the regular season. That game will help break up a long road stretch for the Bulls, with nine road games out of 11.

SEVEN FOR SEVEN:

An assist for Huston Karpman Friday night helped him stay atop the head-to-head series, earning his seventh point of the year against North Iowa, with three goals and four assists. #7 has some company in that category now, though, with Colby Joseph moving into a tie with Karpman thanks to his two goals on Friday. Bulls forward Byron Hartley has paced the head-to-head effort for the Bulls, scoring three goals in five games against the Minotauros.

ABOUT THE STOPPERS:

Minot has given Hunter Garvey plenty of work the last couple of times the teams have faced off at Maysa Arena. His 45 saves in the teams' get-together on October 9 was briefly a career-best, until his 49-save performance on December 4 at St. Cloud. His 43 saves last night is the third-highest mark in his junior career. Austin Zavoda made his first NAHL start last night, but not his first start against North Iowa - as an NA3HL team last January, the Bulls pinned a 4-3 loss on him in a home matchup against Shattuck-St. Mary's, but Zavoda would rebound for a 3-2 win at home in March, making 25 saves in a 4-3 win for the Sabres.

THE HOMETOWN KID:

Even though he only appeared in a few shifts for North Iowa, Mason City native and current Mason City Toros forward Nik Howell became the seventh Mason City-born player to appear in a Tier II junior game or higher when he stepped onto the ice in the Bulls' 5-4 loss to Aberdeen last Saturday. The last player to come from Mason City was current Minnesota-Duluth Bulldog Kobe Roth, who moved to Warroad, Minnesota as an eighth-grader and went on to play in both the NAHL and USHL for the Minnesota Wilderness and the Des Moines Buccaneers. The list does not include four players with North Iowa roots who played for the Bulls during their decade in the NA3HL.

THE EARLY BIRD:

When the Bulls have needed an early spark, it seems Logan Dombrowsky has been the man to have involved this season - the Stevens Point, Wisconsin native has scored at least one goal in eight games this season, and in four of them, his marker has been the very first of the night. (In fact, the Bulls' first goal as an NAHL club came off of his stick, halfway through the first period of North Iowa's September 15 game against the Minnesota Wilderness.) Dombrowsky has also had a point in four of the team's six earliest goals this season (all coming less than three minutes into the game), and his game-opening goals last weekend were the team's earliest and third-earliest of the year.
