#### IN A NUTSHELL:

After taking a loss last night, North Iowa opens a pivotal road weekend against the Wings.

#### **ALL-TIME SERIES:**

North lowa trails, 1-2-3 (last three meetings have all been shootout losses).

#### LAST TIME OUT:

Special teams ended up an especially important part of Thursday night's game at the Mason City Arena, with both the Bulls and St. Cloud Norsemen registering at least one power play goal as St. Cloud snatched a 4-2 win. Blake Mesenburg opened the scoring for the Norsemen on a clearing attempt that never got out of the zone, firing one in from the right wing for a shorthanded tally at 4:27 of the first period for a 1-0 lead. Ryan O'Neill's shot from the left wing rattled in under the crossbar for a power play goal just 47 seconds out of the break, giving St. Cloud a two-goal lead. The game's only 5-on-5 tally came at 10:43 of the second period, when Brett Morich's shot from the left wing was blocked to Casey Roepke, who roped his shot past a wellscreened Tomas Bolo. Halfway through the Bulls' second power play of the night, Dylan Gajewski fed the puck in front for Jack Campion, who dragged it past Bolo to tie the game with 7:57 showing on the clock. A five-minute power play after a high cross-check from Greg Japchen, however, opened the door for a St. Cloud go-ahead goal, and Brandon Lajoie tossed his contribution into the net at 4:56 of the third to give St. Cloud the lead for good. Blake Perbix ended the night with an empty-net goal with 1:33 left. St. Cloud went 2-for-2 on the man-advantage, while the Bulls closed out the night at 1-for-3.

#### **NEXT HOME GAME:**

North Iowa returns home to face the Austin Bruins on Friday, February 4, a game which will help break up a long road stretch for the Bulls, with nine road games out of 11.

#### AT THE TOP OF THEIR GAME:

Four Bulls will represent their team as part of the Central Division roster at the North American Hockey League's Top Prospects Tournament in Pittsburgh on February 7 and 8. The rosters were announced on Tuesday afternoon, with Carter Rapalje, Michael Mesic, Logan Dombrowsky and Dylan Gajewski earning spots in the event - Rapalje scored a goal at last year's showcase, representing the South Division as a member of the Amarillo Bulls, while the other three are making their first appearances. The Central Division will face the Midwest in a Monday-evening matchup, followed by a Tuesday morning game against the South Division all-stars. Three others who played for North Iowa during their NA3HL careers - Zack Simon (Minot), Carson Jones (Springfield) and Max Gutjahr (Amarillo) will also appear at the Top Prospects event at the UPMC Lemieux Sports Complex.

#### SHOOTOUT AT THE O.K. CORRAL:

Despite Aberdeen's five wins in their six meetings against North Iowa, the series is about as close as they get, with the teams going to a shootout in each of their last three meetings. It's the first time North Iowa has ever played an opponent to a shootout in three straight meetings, and only the second time the Bulls have faced an opponent in three shootouts in the same season - the Chicago Hitmen won two of their three shootouts against North Iowa in the Bulls' inaugural NA3HL campaign in 2011-12.

#### **ROAD WARRIORS:**

Thursday's game marks a much-needed break in a heavy road schedule for the Bulls - North lowa finds itself in the midst of a stretch of nine road games out of 11, and six full weekends out of eight away from home. The reward is on the horizon, though - the Bulls play nine of their last 12 games of the regular season, including eight of their final 10, on home ice at the Mason City Arena.

### **FIRST THINGS FIRST:**

North Iowa enjoyed two firsts in Thursday night's game despite the loss to St. Cloud, as Casey Roepke and Jack Campion notched their first NAHL goals of the season. Roepke has been in the scoring column four times previously, scoring two goals last season for the Amarillo Bulls and two in 2019-20 as a member of the Janesville Jets. Campion's goal was his first in the NAHL, after posting 56 points for the Mason City Toros earlier this season - he is still the team's second-leading scorer despite not appearing in a Toros contest since December 22. He notched 16 goals last season for the Bulls in the NA3HL, and added three more points in last April's Fraser Cup tournament.
