### IN A NUTSHELL:

North lowa plays its final gamethe Odde Ice Center this season, barring a meeting with the Wings in the Robertson Cup Playoffs.

### **ALL-TIME SERIES:**

North lowa trails, 2-3-4 (first three OT losses in shootout: earned 1st\_ever road win at Aberdeen January 28).

#### LAST TIME OUT:

The Bulls got within two-and-a-half minutes of their second road win of the year at Aberdeen Friday night, but a fluke turnover in front of the net flipped the script, with Cade Neilson burying the game's tying and winning goals to sink North Iowa in overtime, 4-3. The teams sprinted out of the gate and onto the scoreboard, starting with a backdoor goal from Kyle Gaffney at the 42-second mark of the game. Within the next four minutes, Jack Campion tied the game and Seamus Campbell picked up a breakaway goal to get the lead back. Aberdeen had the 2-1 lead and a 13-4 shots-on-goal advantage heading to the second period, but a breakaway goal from Hunter Bulger less than a minute out of the break pulled North lowa even, and a setup pass from Michael Mesic found Byron Hartley on the doorstep for a go-ahead marker with 1:12 left in the second. That fateful turnover ended up at the feet of Neilson with 2:33 left, and his goal on a double-deke slid through Kyle Kozma to tie the game at 3-3 and send the game to overtime. 43 seconds into the extra session, Neilson walked around an attempted block from Sean Vlasich before facing up and scoring the game-winner. Campion and Mesic had two points apiece for North lowa, while Kozma posted 37 saves in the overtime defeat. Campbell had a goal and an assist in addition to Neilson's two goals.

#### **NEXT HOME GAME:**

The Bulls return to home ice Friday and Saturday, February 18 and 19 as the Bismarck Bobcats make the trip to Mason City. Friday's game is the Bulls' Fan Appreciation Night, with foam "Thumbs-Up" hands going to the first 100 fans in the door on National Thumbs-Up Night, and Saturday's game will feature an on-ice Tug-of-War tournament for National Tug-of-War Night.

### **PENNING QUITE THE STORY:**

Philadelphia, Pennsylvania native Byron Hartley continues to crank out the scoring for the Bulls, adding a goal in last night's loss to the Wings - he has posted points in seven of his last nine games, bumping his total for the season to 15 goals and 11 assists. Of his 26 points this season, 13 have come just since January 15, and his 15 goals for the year are second on the team behind only Carter Rapalje.

### FINALLY HOME:

As junior hockey teams across the country lock in their final rosters for the season, the Bulls got quite a welcome gift from their newest netminder last weekend - Kyle Kozma made his North Iowa debut with 25 saves, earning the win in last Saturday's 4-2 win over Austin. Kozma is settling in at his final junior stop after previously winning five games for the Aberdeen Wings and Minnesota Magicians this year, and playing in his native Canada for the Virden Oil Capitals, North York Rangers and Drumheller Dragons in previous seasons. As if last week's game wasn't enough excitement, Kozma also celebrated his 21st birthday on Wednesday. Kozma was the goaltender in both of the Wings' first two regular-season games against North Iowa, splitting the two outings.

### THE MILESTONE MAN:

Jack Campion's two points in Friday's game officially put him at the century mark for his junior career, making him the 17th player in North Iowa Bulls history to hit the 100-point mark all-time. 11 of those points have come since making his debut on the NAHL scoresheet on December 17 with an assist at Bismarck. Joining him on the 100-point list this season is former Bulls teammate and 2022-23 Bulls tender Carter Newpower, who reached the 100-point mark January 29 at New Ulm. (77 of Newpower's 108 career points have come this season as a member of the Mason City Toros).

### THE OTHER MILESTONE MAN:

North Iowa defenseman Greg Japchen returns to the lineup tonight, sitting out since January 28 after a high cross-check to Blake Perbix the previous night. He returns to immediately mark a career milestone, playing in his 100th junior hockey game this evening (not including a single NCDC contest in 2018-19). Three of those games came in the United States Hockey League with Madison and Omaha, and the Bulls will likely mark the occasion in a more official manner in two weeks, when he is set to take the ice for his 100th North American Hockey League fixture.
