North lowa hunts for a weekend sweep after earning a win in the Nelson Center on Friday.

ALL-TIME SERIES:

IN A NUTSHELL:

North Iowa leads, 2-1-0 (Bulls have won both meetings on Fridays).

LAST TIME OUT:

The Bulls are back in the win column, with the defensemen doing much of the heavy lifting in a 3-1 triumph Friday night over the Springfield Jr. Blues. North lowa grabbed control of the game at 8:47 of the first period, when **Brett Morich's** shot from the top of the slot sneaked past the traffic in front of the net and beat Aksel Reid off the bottom of the crossbar for a 1-0 advantage. The Bulls did not score on their first power play of the night but the Jr. Blues did – in the final seconds of a hooking infraction against **Justin Mexico**, Hagen Moe grabbed a rebound in front of the net off of Cole Dubicki's shot and stuffed it home to tie the game at 10:40 of the second. North lowa took advantage of a double-minor from Leo Bacallao, with **Sean Vlasich** ripping a shot over Reid's right shoulder to take the lead back with 16.5 seconds left in the period and a fraction of a second remaining on the power play. The teams battled to a stalemate in the third, and **Greg Japchen** pitched the puck into the empty net to seal the win with 90 seconds left, slinging it from the hash marks in the North lowa end. **Hunter Garvey** made 33 saves to earn his 14th win of the season, and **Jack Mesic** earned a pair of assists of his own.

NEXT HOME GAME:

The Bulls welcome the Austin Bruins to the River City on Friday, March 11 to begin the home stretch with "Reading Stampede" night, featuring a book exchange at the game.

CAPPING OFF THE NIGHT:

Greg Japchen's goal in the final seconds of Friday's game capped off a memorable night for the Bulls blueliner – Japchen celebrated his 100th NAHL game with the empty-net tally, sending in the game's final goal from 165 feet away. Japchen joined **Jack Mesic** and **Casey Roepke** in reaching the 100-game mark in an NAHL uniform, while **Jake LaRusso** reached the century mark with the New Jersey Titans. The next North Iowa player on pace to play his 100th NAHL contest is **Sean Vlasich**, who comes into the night with 94 NAHL games under his belt.

A "LINC" TO THE PAST:

After hosting the Jr. Blues back in December, the Bulls finish their first-ever trip to Springfield tonight – this week's visit to the capital city is the first by a Mason City-based team in the regular season since November 15, 2008, when future Ohio State defenseman Alex Carlson scored the North Iowa Outlaws' only goal in a 4-1 loss. The Outlaws went 6-8-1 at the Nelson Center, including an overtime loss to close out the team's final playoff run in 2009.

THE ONE THEY WANTED:

North Iowa's defensive effort in Friday's game will go down as one of its best of the season, allowing just a single goal against the Jr. Blues – the Bulls are still hunting for their first shutout win of the season, but the one-goal allowance was the first since a September 17 win over the Amarillo Wranglers at the NAHL Showcase. The win was even more valuable in light of Aberdeen's win over Minot on Friday, putting the Bulls back within two points of the fourth-place Minotauros with two games in hand. Now, North Iowa hunts for its first weekend sweep since knocking off Austin on November 12 and 13.

HEAVY HITTERS:

The two teams combined to score 16 goals in their weekend get-together before Christmas, and two players in particular handled a hefty chunk of the scoring those nights. **Dylan Gajewski** notched a hat trick in the Friday night affair, a 4-3 overtime win that included a game-winner for Gajewski in just his third game with the team. Hagen Moe scored two goals in that game and added another in a 6-3 win the following night – that night was a potent one for the Bulls' power play, going 2-for-9. Moe also scored Springfield's only goal last week, with Springfield taking 3-0 and 9-1 losses at the Janesville Jets.

KEEP THE POWER UP:

The Bulls' power play goal from Sean Vlasich continued their run of success on the man-advantage against Midwest Division teams, scoring in all three games against Springfield so far. North Iowa also notched power play goals at the NAHL Showcase against Kenai River and the Minnesota Wilderness.
