IN A NUTSHELL:

North Iowa wraps up its first season in the North American Hockey League with a game against the Central Division's top team.

ALL-TIME SERIES:

North Iowa trails. 1-4-2 (Bulls: won first-ever meeting November 20).

LAST TIME OUT:

The Bulls closed out a 28-game home slate on Friday night with a Good Friday get-together against St. Cloud – despite an early shorthanded goal for the Norsemen, the Good Friday got off to a good start for North Iowa. Four straight goals, though - three in the third period - turned the game toward St. Cloud for a 5-3 Norsemen victory. The shorthanded marker went to Blake Mesenburg, who dashed down the ice for a breakaway goal just 5:39 into the game, but the Bulls answered back with a back-post goal from Tyler Braccini at 7:49 and a one-timer on the doorstep from Simone Dadie at 9:27 for a 2-1 lead at the break. A five-minute stretch flipped the script in the second period, though - Peyton Hanson scored to tie the game at 4:19, followed by a go-ahead tally from Nick Young at the right point at the 6:04 mark to make it a 3-2 game. Ethan Benz scored at 9:20 of the period, putting the Norsemen in front by two going to the final period, and a rebound would dribble out on front of **Kyle Kozma** at 9:05 of the third period, with Kade Peterson pouncing on it for a 5-2 advantage. North lowa answered on a shorthanded goal from Michael Mesic – a 2-on-1 alongside Carter Rapalje with 7:25 to go – but the Bulls got no closer. Braccini scored in his final home game as a Bull, while Rapalje and Greg Japchen each notched assists in their home finales -Kozma took the loss with 25 saves. The penalty-killing units were sparkling, combining to go 8-for-8 in the game with a pair of goals.

TONIGHT'S PROMOTIONS:

The home season winds down with a final postgame skate and jersey auction - a mix of the team's home whites and navy blue away jerseys will be auctioned, and fans can skate with the Bulls immediately following the conclusion of the game.

GO THE DISTANCE:

Tonight's game will mark the last of 60 games for North Iowa this season, in the market's return to NAHL hockey for the first time since 2010 - it also marks the first time in Bulls history that North lowa fans will not see the home team in the playoffs, after going 10-for-10 in qualifying for the NA3HL Fraser Cup postseason. However, this game ends the second-longest season in North Iowa Bulls history, inclusive of the postseason - the 2013-14 campaign ended in the USA Hockey Tier III national championship game with a 4-1 loss to the Boston Jr. Bruins, ending a remarkable 57-5 season. The following season, the Bulls played 60 games as well, claiming the final USA Hockey junior national crown.

THANK YOU FOR BEING A FRIEND:

Despite some new circumstances - a new league with new opponents (some in far-flung locales) - and a first-of-its-kind finish at the bottom of the division standings, North Iowa hockey fans embraced the team's move to the NAHL this season, with 30,983 fans spending an evening at the Mason City Arena during the course of the year, an average of 1,106 per night. The season also marked a return to full capacity - and in many ways, a return to normalcy – after a season beset by COVID-related restrictions on capacity and gatherings.

A FOND FAREWELL:

This game marks the last junior outing for eight North Iowa players born in the year 2001 - players born in this year age out of junior hockey following the season. Two players from this class - Sean Vlasich and Greg Japchen - have already announced NCAA Division I commitments, while two others have made decisions and have college announcements pending. Carter Rapalje (28 goals) is set to finish his final season of junior hockey as the Bulls' top goal-scorer of the season, and he comes in with a chance to be the team's first 30-goal scorer since current Lincoln Star Lucas Wahlin in 2019-20.

SCOUTING ST. CLOUD:

The Norsemen have long since clinched the top spot in the Central Division race, earning home-ice advantage through the Robertson Cup playoffs. They haven't exactly slowed their momentum recently, either, winning 25 of their last 31 games and only once dropping back-to-back decisions. Ryan O'Neill's scoring luck did finally run out April 2 at Austin, ending his scoring streak at 11 games, the organization's longest such streak in nine years (Thomas Williams, 2012-13). Tomas Bolo enters the night with 28 wins, second in team history (Jacob Meyers, 2011-12).
